Important Information for Guests

Lift

The lift is for disabled access and luggage only. It is not designed to carry people up and down all the time and so misuse may cause the lift to break down. Only 2 people in the lift at one time please, and no children under 16 unless supervised by an adult over 25.

Pool

To open the gate to the pool, lift up the knob on the right hand side. The light switch for the pool lights is on the left of the gate, before you go in to the pool area.

Barbecue

Please can you clear your ash from the bbq before you leave by emptying it into the woods. Charcoal is available at the supermarkets.

Rotary Washing Line

Please wind up the rotary washing line when not in use.

Fuse box

Should the electricity trip, the main fuse box is in the laundry room should you need to reset it.

Flies

Unfortunately dead flies can be a problem in tall, old houses. In the château this mainly affects the gym, gym bathroom, master bedroom bathroom and the green room at the end of the first floor corridor. We employ a contractor to deal with this problem regularly and take every measure possible to keep this problem to a minimum. During the summer months, there shouldn't be a problem. We hope you do not experience any problems, but there are vacuum cleaners on every floor if you need them.

Trampoline

To the side of the pool is a trampoline. Using a trampoline can cause injuries, so please use at your own risk. Children must be supervised at all times whilst using the trampoline.

SAFETY INFORMATION REGARDING THE RUINS AND PONDS

Please do not enter or explore the ruins – they are not safe.

If you have children with you, please be aware that there are two ponds. One is on the other side of the ruin to the château and is fenced off. The second is to the right of the front of the house and has a natural bramble barrier; however this is not impenetrable.

PLEASE MAKE SURE EVERYONE IN YOUR PARTY IS AWARE OF THE SAFETY ISSUES REGARDING THE RUINS AND THE PONDS.

First aid boxes are located in the cabinet by the kitchen loo, a hallway cupboard with the first aid logo on the outside and with the travel cots on the top floor.

House Peculiarities

Porch

To open the door into the porch on the side of the house, please note that the key needs to go in and out of the lock horizontally. To open the second set of doors leading directly into the kitchen, turn the key fully round twice.

Insinkerator

The small white vertical button next to the tap by the sink on the island which should operate the insinkerator but only works intermittently. To operate the insinkerator please use the switch in the cupboard underneath the sink if the button doesn't work.

Hot Water

You may find that the water in the bathrooms takes a long time to heat up. This is an old house and it can take even longer than you can possibly imagine you might have to wait! So remember to turn on the shower 3 minutes before you want one, and start running a bath using only the hot tap until it runs warm.

Pool

Please avoid putting up the umbrella by the pool on a windy day. Weighting the umbrella down is also inadvisable as it can cause it to break in a strong wind. (We speak from experience!)

Bedrooms

In the **red twin room**, (up the stairs, turn left, first bedroom on the right) please **do not flush toilet paper** down the mechanical toilet as it will flood, but use the bags and bin provided. We cannot stress this point enough!

Cooker

The hobs on top of the cooker are gas but the in-built ignition spark does not work. Please use the hand operated ignition gadget.

Portable beds

The bar which is used to keep the bed closed is also used to secure the bed when it is open. Please use this bar to keep the middle legs together. Please take care with these beds as they are not designed to be jumped on or to be sat on and they will break if used in this fashion. They are purely for occasional use.

Please can you put the bins on the road as shown in this picture. They may not be collected if not correctly positioned. Thank you very much.



The bins get collected early on the following **Wednesdays (alternate)**. Please can you put them out the night before.

It may be that your bin is not due to be collected during your stay. If this is the case, please still take it down to the end of the drive but leave it inside the gates.

If your bin is due to be collected during your visit and you find a full bin left by previous guests by the gates, please put it out for collection along with your own bin. When they have been emptied, please return them to just inside the gates. Thank you very much for helping in this way.

Waste (recycling and landfill) Information

The bins are kept at the top of the drive, just inside the gates.

The recycling bin has the yellow lid. Please put all plastics and metal tins/cans in this bin.

The landfill bin has a black lid. Please place everything else (including paper and cardboard) in this bin, other than glass.

Please take all glass to the glass recycling point behind the Mairie in St Philbert. Please see the map below:



Please be aware that we are charged for contaminated recycling bins, so make sure you dispose of your waste correctly. We are also charged to take glass to the recycling point if you haven't done this. We have to pass on charges incurred from guests to those guests if waste is not managed correctly. We really don't want this to happen. Please ensure that no waste is left in the Chateau at the end of your stay.

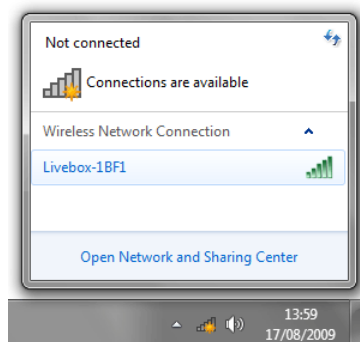
Internet connectivity is available throughout the entire chateau via a wireless LAN (Wi-Fi)

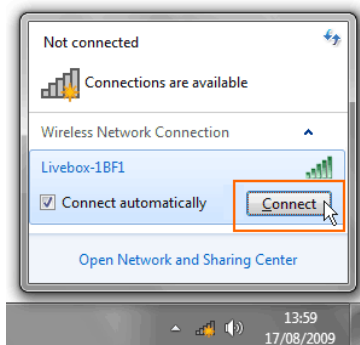
The network security key is 26 characters long. It can be found in the Chateau manual.

The following instructions are designed to assist in setting up a connection for the first time using a Windows 7 laptop, but any device with Wi-Fi capability should be able to use the chateau internet connection.

1. Turn on wireless connectivity on your laptop
2. Click on the  icon in the bottom right hand corner of your screen
3. A list of available networks will display
4. Locate the 'chateau-WLAN' in the list of wireless network connections (in the example below the SSID of the router is 'Livebox-1BF1'):



5. Select the router from list and click 'Connect':



6. You should then be prompted to type the network security key.

TV operating instructions

To watch Freesat channels

Please note when watching via Freesat – programs are on UK time e.g. the News at 10pm is on at 11pm.

1. Turn on the TV by pressing the bottom button on the controls on the right hand side of the TV as shown in the photo below.

1. Put detergent in the dispenser (try to break the tablet up as sometimes it doesn't get dissolved and goes in the wash but ends up as a lump in the dispenser).
2. Turn the dial to "P" (12 o'clock).
3. Decide which wash cycle you would like and turn the dial to the corresponding letter.
4. Decide the speed of the spin and turn to desired speed.
5. If you would like a different start/stop rinse/additional rinsing – press the appropriate button.
6. Press Start/Pause button to start.

Drying Clothes

Please feel free to use both the washing lines outside. There is also a clothes horse in the laundry room, and a tumbler dryer which is simple to use.

Tumbler Dryer

1. Select either high or low heat option. Either press the button so it sticks out for **low heat**, or press it again so that the button stays in for **high heat**.
2. Turn the dial to select the number of minutes.
3. Press start.
4. At the end of the cycle, please remember to empty the lint trap, located at the bottom of the dryer doorway.



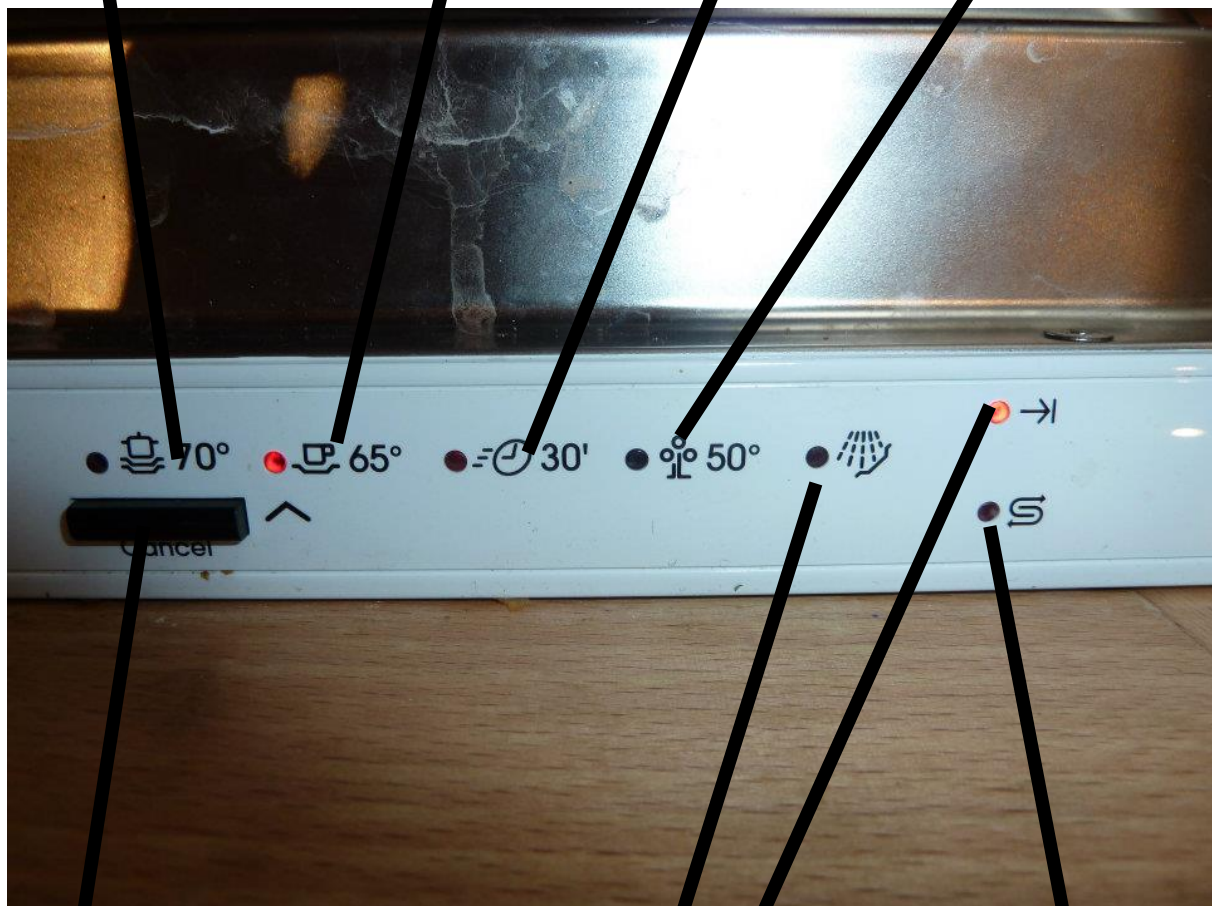

Dishwasher instructions

1. Set the washing programme with the door ajar. The washing programme only starts after you close the door. Until then it is possible to modify the settings
2. Make sure that the appliance is in setting mode. (The appliance is in setting mode when all the programme indicator lights are off and the end-of-programme indicator light flashes.)
3. Press the programme selection/cancel button again and again to set the preferred washing programme. The programme indicator light comes on.
4. Close the door.
The washing programme starts automatically.

General Pool Maintenance



1. Open the pool cover using the key. (It will retract with the key automatically.) To put the pool cover back on the key needs to be held in the “close” position until the cover is on. This is a safety feature where as soon as you relax the turn of the key the pool cover stops unreeling.
2. Clear the 3 skimmer boxes of debris and ensure filters are clean. (Pull them out and tap them upside down.) The skimmer boxes are sunk into the ground and two are located between the pool cover and the hedge, and the other is by the key hole for the pool cover.
3. Use the skimming net on the pole to remove general leaf matter.
4. Around the steps there tends to be sediment. This is because the vacuum cleaner cannot access this area. The best thing is to disturb the sediment first thing in the day so it floats into the main pool and then it will be filtered.
5. We highly recommend that you put the pool cover on at the end of each day as it will help keep the pool temperature up. The pool can lose around 2 degrees of heat overnight if left uncovered!
6. There are metal studs around the pool which are used to secure the winter pool cover. These should be flush with the paving but can sometimes lift slightly becoming a hazard to toes. If this is a problem please contact Isabelle.

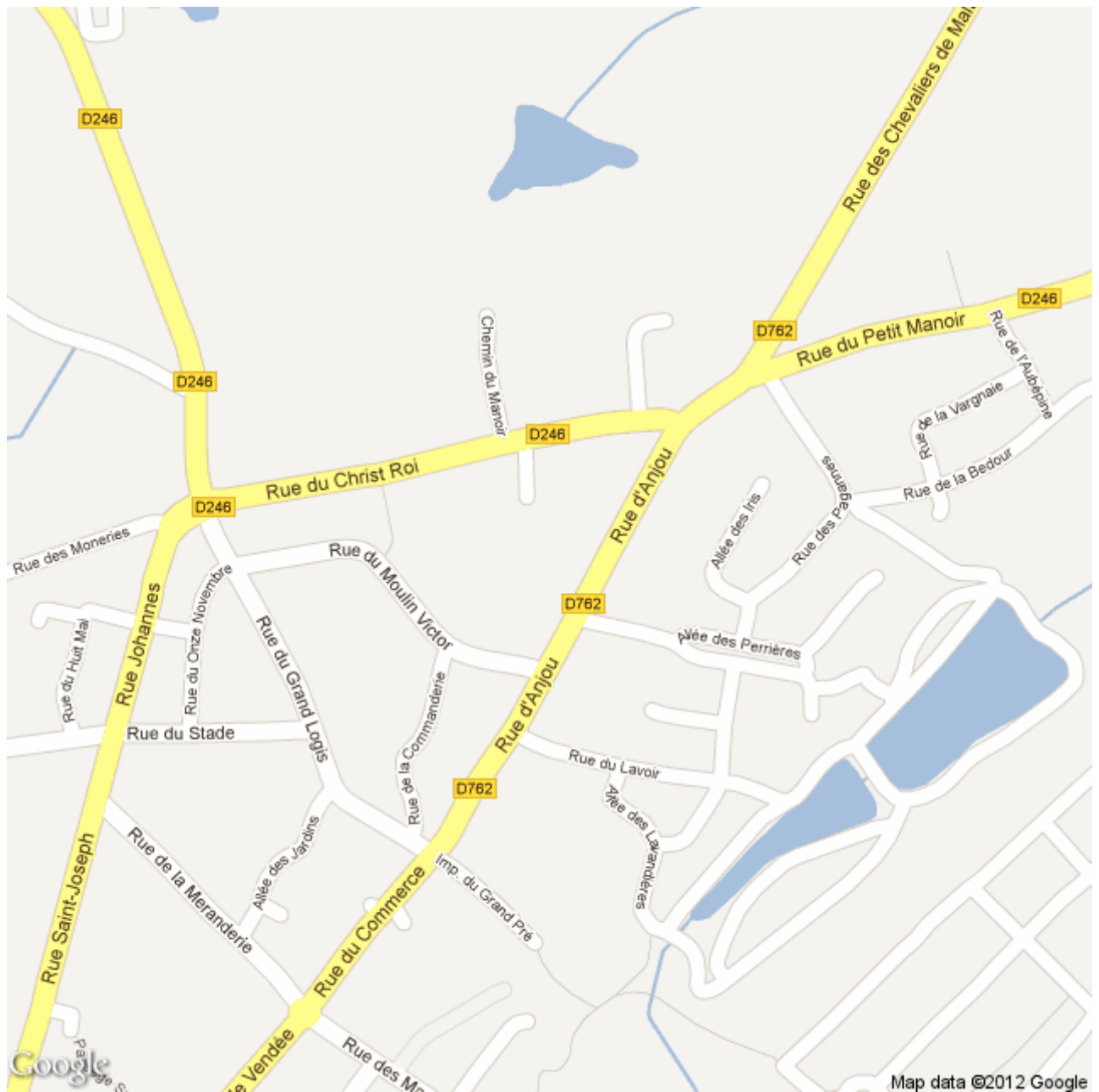

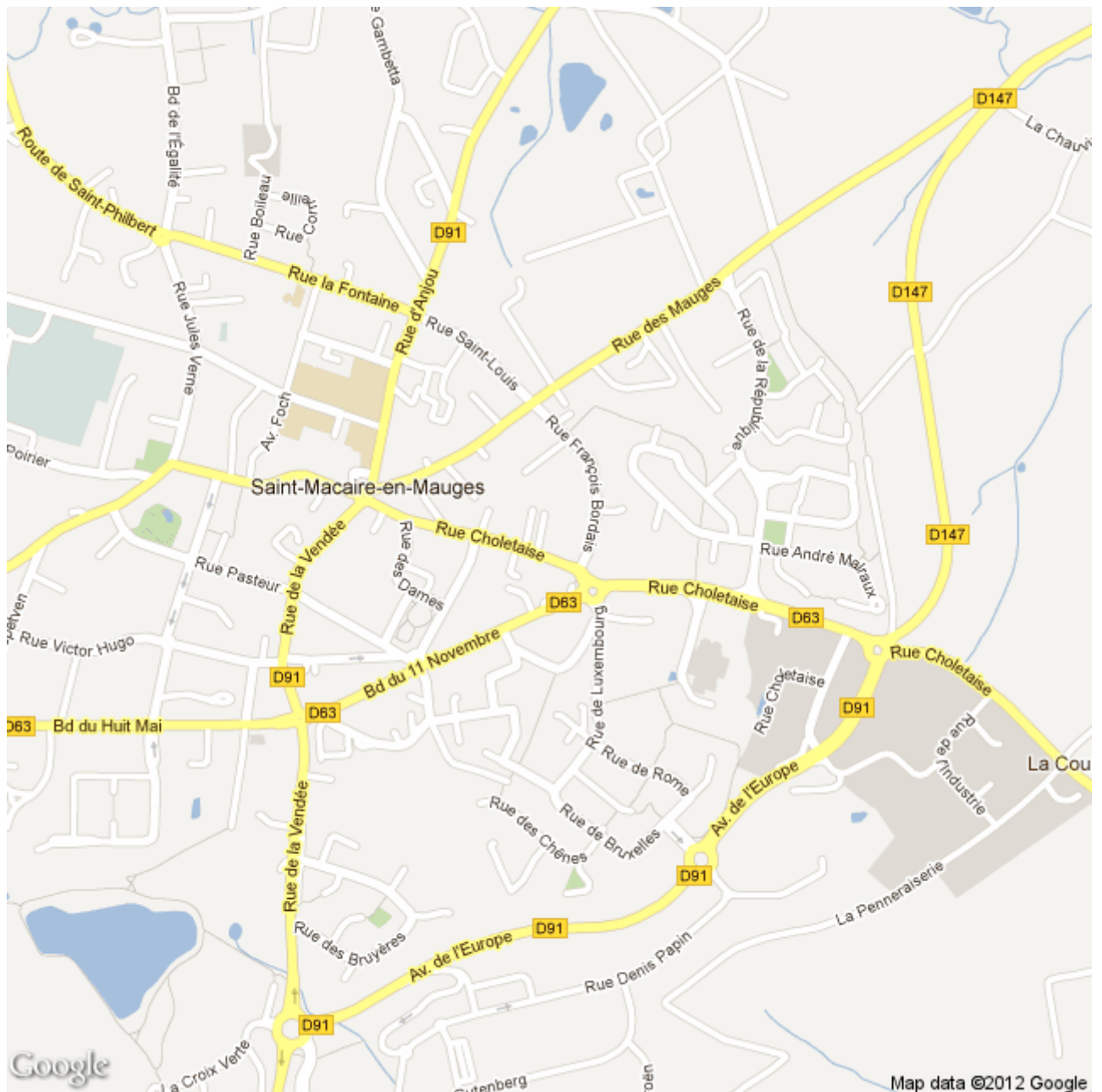

Departure Day

We very much hope that you have enjoyed your stay at Château de bois Giraud. Check out time (unless you have been told otherwise) is 10 am, which enables the cleaners to get the house ready for the next guests. Please can you take note of the following requirements:

Please ensure that:

- all chairs, and any other furniture that may have been moved, have been returned to their original location.
- all tea towels that you have used have been washed and put away, other than the one you're using.
- all washing up has been done and put away, including emptying the dishwasher. Sinks should be left clean. Please ensure that the fridge, freezer, wine cooler, microwave and cooker/oven are empty and clean. The kitchen is one of the most time consuming areas to return to the condition which you found it, so please allow adequate time.
- the games room is tidy, with puzzles and toys put back on the shelves, and the table clear. This can be one of the most challenging rooms if children have been staying so please allow adequate time.
- all windows are closed (you may leave shutters open)
- the pool area is tidy, with chairs and tables as you found them, and all inflatable toys put back in the shed
- if you used the barbecue, please empty the ash and clean the utensils
- you leave a note with details of any breakages so that the items can be replaced
- all recycling (in our area, only plastics and metal tins/cans can be put recycling) is in the recycling wheelie bin at the top of the drive (it has the yellow lid)
- all landfill rubbish to be put in the landfill wheelie bin at the top of the drive (it has the black lid). Please put all cardboard and paper in landfill.
- all glass has been taken to the glass recycling point at the back of the Mairie in St Philbert
- please be aware that we are charged for contaminated recycling bins, so please make sure you dispose of your waste correctly. We are also charged to take glass to the recycling point if you haven't done this. We have to pass on charges incurred from guests to those guests if waste is not managed correctly. We really don't want this to happen.

Please note that if these requirements are not met, we will be charged extra by the cleaning company. This is a cost that will be passed directly on to you and deducted from your security deposit, as covered by the terms and conditions for rental. However, we very much wish to avoid this as the cleaning company do not like having to send additional cleaner/s at a moment's notice as it stressful.

At the back of this manual you will find spare check lists to help you remind you of how the Chateau must be left. Please feel free to take one or more of these, so that you can tick off the jobs as you do them.

Keys

Unless you have been told otherwise, as you leave, please post the key sets for the pool and the chateau in the post box in the wall at the end of the drive.

We greatly appreciate your cooperation in leaving the house tidy, and hope you have a safe journey home.

Leaving the Chateau after your visit

We very much hope that you have enjoyed your stay at Château de bois Giraud. Check out time (unless you have been told otherwise) is 10 am, which enables the cleaners to get the house ready for the next guests.

Please be aware that you must ensure that the Chateau is left as you found it. This might seem simple and obvious, but given the size of the house this takes much longer than you can think, especially if children are amongst the guests. We advise that you put aside several hours the afternoon before you leave for this task. To help remind you of how the Chateau must be left, we have created a check list below. Please feel free to tick off the jobs as you do them.

- please be aware that we are charged for contaminated recycling bins, so please make sure you dispose of your waste correctly. We are also charged to take glass to the recycling point if you haven't done this. We have to pass on charges incurred from guests to those guests if waste is not managed correctly. We really don't want this to happen.

Please note that if these requirements are not met, we will be charged extra by the cleaning company. This is a cost that will be passed directly on to you and deducted from your security deposit, as covered by the terms and conditions for rental. However, we very much wish to avoid this as the cleaning company do not like having to send additional cleaner/s at a moment's notice as it stressful.
